OCTOBER & NOVEMBER REPORT

1. The Clinic Committee Executive had two emergency meetings to deliberate over the problems confronting the clinic projects: The priority centered on (i) The toilet (ii) Office and sleeping rooms, (iii) The kitchen, (iv) The sign Board and the, (v) New Road under construction to link the Accra-Hohoe trunk road.
2. At the General meeting held at the close of the first week of October, we planned and organized communal labour of which clearance of the road straight from the Lorry road to the Clinic was cleared. Flat boards were purchased and used for a temporary bridge to make it accessorial for vehicle usage

November

3. Again at the General meeting on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2007, the Committee decided to change the inscription on the sign board: "HEALTH POST" following a query by some medical officers from the Ministry of Health who were misled to think that clinic is under the ministry of Health and upgraded to a Health Post (Hospital). The name is to read: "Birth Attendance and General Clinic".
4. The communal labour organised this time target the uprooting some stumps and trees on the new road under construction.
5. Tiles were purchased to be laid on the floor of the toilet and both room.
6. The house in conjunction with the Birth Attendant have arranged with a pharmacist to supply the clinic with drugs and also to bring a visiting Doctors who works at the pharmacy to our clinic to attract more patients.
7. The committee appreciated the work of the Birth Attendant and commended her on dedicated service and good performance. She was encouraged to continue until we get an assistant to help her.

8. We wish to appeal for funds to pay the Birth Attendant and the watchman. We need more drugs to increase the stock as it is inadequate to cater for the ever rapidly increasing number of patients.
9. As the patronage continues to rise we wish to appeal for two wheel chairs to help facilitate the free and easy movement of the pregnant mothers and old age patients.
10. Some bereavement has occurred on the watchman who lost his son the only child he has, and a member of the Clinic Committee who is the representative of the Chiefs and Elders of the Alakpati Community. His name is Antor Kofi. The former is to be buried on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2007, while the member of the house has been laid to rest already on the 8<sup>th</sup> December, 2007.

Remarks: 1. Patronage was on the average because free treatment was given to the orphanage and school children who attend the clinic.

2. Revenue came from child birth and other sicknesses.
3. The national Health Insurance scheme has drawn some of the people who got the cards to Hospitals.
4. The community has constructed a new road straight from the trunk road to the clinic.
5. The problem to be tackled is a bridge and gravelling.
6. One W.C. toilet and one bathroom with shower has been completed.
7. Income from the drugs has supported drugs replacement and maintenance cost to buy cement blocks for a seat of the water tank.
8. I bought a sterilizer set and 1 delivery set at a cost of 480,000.00.

We are grateful for the payment of our salaries and drugs sent to us. We thank you very much for this wonderful gesture. May the almighty God reward you with good health.
